

COUNCIL RESOLUTION CL99/033

- (b) 1. That approval be given to the policy that
- A. From 2001 there be no formal prerequisites for admission to any undergraduate course or program within the University. Admission requirements, such as portfolios and TOEFL, will remain unaffected.
 - B. Where pre-existing disciplinary knowledge on the part of students entering a course, program, or subject is assumed, the School, the Faculty, and the University be responsible for ensuring that clear, unambiguous, and constructive advice is given to prospective students on:
 - i. the precise nature and extent of the pre-existing disciplinary knowledge which is assumed; and
 - ii. how students can achieve the level of knowledge required.
 - C. All course or program proposals provide information on:
 - i. the advice which will be given to prospective students in accordance with the above resolution; and
 - ii. a justification of the level of pre-existing disciplinary knowledge which is assumed, based on factors which include the nature of the course, the qualifications typically possessed by entering students, and secondary school enrolment patterns.
2. That the Academic Board monitor and report annually to Council on the effects of these new provisions over the next three years of undergraduate intake, noting the importance of clarity in advice to prospective students and Schools and of effective bridging provisions, and of the experience of the Faculties on teaching outcomes.
